Council Notes

Regrettably, the Parish Council's October meeting had to be cancelled because our Clerk Mandy Senior contracted Covid-19 earlier that month. I'm delighted to report that Mandy is on the mend but it's a stark reminder that the virus is still very much with us and that people can contract it even if double-vaccinated. Let's hope that our relatively high immunity and vaccination levels prevent difficulties this winter when the NHS is under strain.

Use of the Parish Hall is practically back up to pre-pandemic levels and the few organisations which have not continued operation have been replaced by new occupants. It's encouraging to see so much activity and I've been pleased to hear so much praise for the refurbishment work undertaken by caretaker Chris Urwin during the months of the lockdown. The forced closure of the Parish Hall turned out to be a great opportunity in this respect and I doubt we'd have done quite as good a job if we'd done the work in fits and starts. Silver linings.

Informal proposals for the refurbishment of the Victorian pavilion at Corchester Field were due to be presented to the Parish Council Meeting on November 24. I'm aware that some people think that the building should not be saved but I disagree. It's a historic building and I think it would be a great pity to lose it. I believe it has great potential to become a focal point for informal recreation - particularly in the summer months when families can enjoy good weather together. I will report back on our progress.

The Parish Council has created a Community Housing Scheme within the new housing development north of the Middle School. It will deliver a bungalow and three houses which we will let once completed. It is anticipated that the first of these houses - the bungalow - will be completed by Easter next year. Council house building has declined significantly over the decades and I hope that community councils such as ours can make a contribution to a much needed revival in the sector.

Huge thanks to local resident Michael Office who has initiated and coordinated a fibre broadband contract with Openreach for Aydon Road, Drive, Crescent & Way, Beech Drive, Bilberry Way, Cragside, Deadridge Lane, Jameson Drive, Milkwell, Milkwell Lane, Siskin Drive and Woodside Avenue. When I met with a Director of Openreach recently (the company that installs the broadband infrastructure that BT use) they assured me that work will start in the next few months, that the rest of Corbridge is included in their commercial plans and they will do all they can to roll out sooner rather than later. I will keep a close eye on this and continue to make the case.

Feedback from pupils, parents and staff on the new facilities at QEHS is excellent although there are some snagging issues. Corbridge Middle School will soon have new modular classrooms and a new track for the 'Daily Mile'. I supported this project financially with my councillor's allowance because I passionately believe that fit and active children learn more and have better mental health. CMS head teacher Jane Kennedy will be moving on at the end of this term and I'd like to wish her all the best and thank her for the excellent work she has done. She will be a hugely missed by pupils and staff. Chair of Governors Jo Holmes stepped down a few months ago and she will also be missed - an extraordinarily hard working and committed governor. I'm sure the new regime will build on the excellent work Jane and Jo have done.

As William has reported, progress is being made with the Community Housing Project I initiated in 2018. This is an innovative and exciting project that will help people stay in the village when rising prices might have otherwise have driven them out. I'm looking forward to the Parish taking the keys for the first unit next year.

Since the last column the pavement on the south side of Main Street, the road and pavement near the Dilston crossing and the bits missed on the Crofts Estate have all been resurfaced.

Another project I'm proud to have supported with my councillor's allowance is the refurbishment and enhancement of the St Andrew's Church organ which is now complete. I'd urge anybody interested to get a long to a service or a recital – the sound is beautiful.


The St Andrew's Church clock was stopped for just under two days recently for the installation of automatic winding units. This brought to an end almost 125 years of manual winding of the clock mechanism installed to celebrate Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee in 1897. The original church clock was instigated in 1767 with two faces, as now, but only the hour hand. The minute hand was not added until 1861. The new mains powered electric winders were installed in the clock tower by by William Scobie-Youngs and Daniel Todd of the Cumbria Clock Company.

Church warden Jean Wilks said: "Last year it was agreed that we should automate the clock so we asked for funding from village organisations and from charitable trusts. Although the stairs, steps and handrails are in good order, the climb and the effort of winding are a potential safety hazard for our volunteers and one which we have been eager to avoid."

Michael Rae, one of five members of the volunteer team who previously climbed the tower to wind the clock, explained how the procedure was done at least three times a week. "The weight that drove the quarter chime was extremely heavy so winding it after more than two days was really hard work."

The project has cost around £7000, funded by Corbridge Parish Council, Corbridge WI, Corbridge Village Trust, the Allchurches Trust, Catherine Cookson Charitable Trust and the Ecclesiastical Trust.

Corbridge Apple Juice

"A great community effort." That was how one of those involved described a sparkling new enterprise in aid of local charities Charlotte Straker and Corbridge Youth Initiative. The idea was to make use of Corbridge apples that might otherwise go to waste to produce Corbridge Apple Juice to then be canned and sold. A community apple pressing weekend at Corbridge Cricket Club in early October attracted a large number of apple donations. They were then washed, pulped and pressed by volunteers to produce juice in a Corbridge Community Partnership project in association with Hadrian Border Brewery at Newburn.

Almost 1400 cans of Corbridge Lightly Sparkling Apple Juice were subsequently produced by the brewery at cost price, with almost half the stock sold within a week - both direct and at a local community fair. The cans cost £2 each or £24 for a box of 12. But at the time of writing this it is not known if any will be left for sale in December. An update on stocks / sales will be provided in due course on the Corbridge Community Facebook page.

John Maude, who helped lead the project, said: "Huge thanks to the 30 or so local households who brought apples or allowed us to raid their gardens - accosted by just one irate householder who'd heard there were some dodgy looking old blokes nicking her apples. Her husband having the day before agreed we could! Thanks too to Corbridge Youth Initiative, Charlotte Straker and Corbridge Community Partnership for their volunteers who joined the excellent picking, cleaning, pulping and pressing squad over the first weekend in October, a great community effort.

"Among the many who helped, two deserve a special mention: Chris Roberts who has been with me in appreciating the joys of apple pressing for many years now and whose idea it was to can the apple juice. And Andy Burrows of Hadrian Border Brewery who popped in to drop the brewery van off on the Saturday morning and ended up staying the entire weekend, doing much of the pressing, as well as bringing all of his experience and care to canning the juice for us at the brewery."

Over £2000 is expected to be raised in total, to be split between the two charities. With plans to repeat the project next autumn and, hopefully, produce larger stocks of Corbridge Apple Juice if even more people come forward with donations of apples.





St Andrew's pulls out all the stops


Work to refurbish and enhance the St Andrew's Church organ is now complete. The organ console was fully restored while a short distance away every pipe was removed and cleaned. With the exception of the 16 foot basses, which were treated in place. The work was carried out by Malcolm Lightbown of John Lightbown and Sons in Tynemouth. An **Organ Restoration Celebration** weekend was held in October, including brief talks and recitals to demonstrate the refurbishment and enhancement of the organ given by Organist Emeritus John Ross (adviser to the project), John Roper and Marc Bryant. Among those attending were Malcolm Lightbown and his father John, who carried out the last restoration in 1979. A Service of Celebration with the Rededication of the Church Organ was held the following day. It also featured a special cake baked by Lynn Ward.

We start with a hat-trick of unique memoirs sprung from the author's obsessions. First up, football. 


