

Council Notes

I hope some of you have noticed the excellent work done by the Parish Council's new 'handyperson' Andrew Cunningham. Signs, benches, bollards and street lamps have been painted throughout the village and



repair work of various kinds has been done. After the pandemic lockdowns the physical appearance of some of our public areas started to deteriorate a little. The shine was taken off in one or two places. I considered it vital to attend to this as a matter of urgency and so proposed the creation of a new part time handyperson role and was pleased when the Council gave their support. Visitors and residents alike can tell when a place is really cared for and looked after. It makes a huge difference to the overall attractiveness of where we live and ultimately, I think, to our well being and happiness.

Within this issue we've issued a plea for the village's builders to consider quoting for refurbishment work to the pavilion at Corchester Field. The building has fallen into severe disrepair but we believe it has great potential if it's carefully restored. The idea is to open it up - rather like a bandstand - so it can be used by the public having picnics and summer barbecues nearby. Other improvements to the field are planned and will hopefully make

Corchester Field into a more valuable and better used public asset.

The first of the Parish's four new council houses on the Roman Fields development is nearing completion - a two bedroom bungalow. It will shortly be available on what is called a social rent. The Parish Council wishes to let these new houses to people with strong links and family connections to the village but there are letting rules and other criteria which we need to meet. Northumberland Homefinder, Northumberland County Council's housing allocation service, is assisting the Parish in letting the house and any resident keen on occupying the new house should register their interest with them.

A difficult winter approaches with heating bills skyrocketing as a result of Putin's effective blockage of gas supplies to Europe. Like the pandemic, it's a time when we must look out for our neighbours and do what we can to help those in need. Let's hope this winter is mild.

The bungalow we are purchasing on the new development next to Corbridge Middle School is nearly ready with three semi-detached two bed houses to follow next year. Shortly after being elected county councillor



in Corbridge I attended a presentation on community housing and not long after that was in a meeting with the developer about other things and asked if they would consider selling some of the units to Corbridge Parish Council. To their credit they were happy to explore it and we got busy exploring the legalities and funding opportunities. We eventually agreed terms on four units and have been very well supported by Northumberland County Council's housing team with 50 per cent funding support and lots of great advice.

The bungalow, the three semis and the units that Riverside Housing will be offering for rental will all be advertised in due course on www.northumberlandhomefinder.org.uk so if you are interested please get registered with the service as soon as possible. We have agreed a 'local lettings policy' which gives priority to people from Corbridge. It's great to see this project finally coming to fruition.

I've been in touch with Openreach for an update on their fibre broadband plans for Corbridge. I'm told the Community Fibre Partnership scheme is progressing and is now in the final stages of planning and they expect to start the build in the next few weeks. This is a scheme at the north end of the village and wouldn't have happened without the excellent efforts of Michael Office. I'll be meeting soon with Openreach for an update on their plans for the rest of the village.


After a few residents contacted me about the bin outside of the Coop being removed I've been in touch with their head office in Manchester and I'm happy to see they have replaced it. The Coop is keen to engage with local communities making donations based on store card spend to local causes including Corbridge United Football Club.

Some people have asked why I did not vote in the meeting at which the Council agreed to 'settle' at over £300,000 with its CEO. I was asked by the council's legal officer not to attend because it was clear that I was 'pre-determined' and as one of the councillors raising these issues it was hard to argue with that. I thought it was utterly wrong to make this payment. A disciplinary investigation should have been commissioned and action taken based on the findings.



100 Years



Corbridge Parish Hall marks its centenary this year. It was erected by Edith Helen Straker-Smith of Howden Dene in memory of her father Joseph and opened in 1922. She had been a trustee when he opened the Charlotte Straker Hospital named in memory of his wife and her mother. The hall was originally given to the 'Vicar and Council' of St Andrew's Church. Ownership was taken over by Corbridge Parish Council in the 1980s. The main hall can accommodate up to 160 people and also has a well equipped kitchen. The separate Mearns Room and Room One each have a capacity of 35 people.

Corbridge UK Concert Premiere



Many people walking in Corbridge recently have been stopped in their tracks by the sound of a concert pianist and violinist floating through the air. The music comes from a house in the village centre where the musically gifted Mykhailichenko family live. They are one of several Ukrainian families now starting new lives in the Tyne Valley.

Khrystyna, aged 17, is already an acclaimed pianist and her 11-year-old sister Sasha is an equally talented violinist. Khrystyna's recent concert in a packed St Andrew's Church was her first ever appearance in the UK and a preview of the programme for a Paris recital last month (September) in the Salle Cortot in aid of a Ukranian charity. With further performances arranged in Vilnius, Gdansk, Germany and the USA.

Khyrstyna began learning the piano when she was four. Her parents quickly realised she was extraordinarily gifted. Within six years she had won many international competitions and was performing in concerts throughout Europe and in New York and Washington. In 2016 she decided to concentrate totally on solo performances rather than competitions.

Khrystyna has played more than 40 times with symphony orchestras worldwide and with almost all of the National Philharmonic Orchestras of Ukraine as well as solo recitals in other European concert halls.

In March 2016 Khrystyna met the international concert pianist Professor Alexei Grynyuk who became her teacher and mentor. He said "Khrystyna's gift is stronger and more powerful than anyone I've ever been able to work with before. This is a performer of the highest level."

Three days after flying into Newcastle Airport and settling into her new home, Khrystyna was travelling (alone for the first time) to Germany and then on to Miami for master classes and concerts. She returned to Corbridge just long enough to confirm she has won a bursary to study at the Royal Northern College of Music in Manchester before setting off again to perform near Warsaw.

Both girls and their older brother Danylo were born in Simferopol in Crimea. The family fled from there in 2014 when the Russians took control of Crimea and moved to Irpin, near Kyiv. One year later, Khrystyna's father Gennady, a Professor of Ukrainian Literature, died tragically in a fishing accident.

Irpin was one of the places we all watched on television when the Russians invaded Ukraine in February, devastating small towns and villages in their ill-fated attempt to take Kyiv. Once again, the Mykhailichenkos packed their suitcases and joined millions of refugees forced to escape from their country. After three months in Poland, they finally arrived here on June 7th. Their brother has stayed in Ukraine.

Sasha is now a pupil at Corbridge Middle School and an enthusiastic member of Corbridge Cricket Club. She has also won a bursary at Sage Gateshead and plays in their Young Sinfonia Orchestra.

Corbridge is incredibly fortunate in having such a talented and resilient family living here and they, along with all of the Ukrainian families now residing in the area, are warmly welcomed.



Young People Are The Future



20 years of Corbridge Youth Initiative

'There is a proverb. It takes a village to raise a child.'

Young people are inquisitive. They like to have fun. They love meeting their friends. They enjoy the stimulus of new, exciting challenges and they will seek information and support from those who offer them acceptance and interesting opportunities.

We offer all of that at Corbridge Youth Initiative, in a safe place, with well qualified staff, in the centre of the village. Over 100 young people attend the range of groups on offer on 4 nights /week during term time. Then there are the holiday and Summer Schemes. In the past year our services have been used by 198 different young people.

It's expensive. Our present funding has ended.

The easy option (the negligent option?) is to leave our young people to find their amusement where they can and for them to take guidance from anyone who happens to spot loitering groups of young people around the village. We don't want that to happen.

We have funds for only 6 months more youth work at present. We need your help.

Twenty years ago in 2002 Corbridge Youth Initiative was registered as a small charity, supported by the village churches and the Parish Council, to extend the provision offered by the Northumberland County Council Youth Service which ran two sessions per week at Corbridge Youth Club. This operated from a dilapidated, temporary / demountable classroom on the Corbridge Middle School site.

Corbridge Youth Initiative's expenditure in its first financial year was £2,569.

Its expenditure in the last financial year was £70,893.

What a lot has changed in 20 years. How has this happened?

As Northumberland Youth Service budgets were cut over the years and provision was reduced in the village, Corbridge Youth Initiative, with the help of funds from the village, its organisations, grant making bodies and other funders, expanded its work to cover the gaps.

After years of fruitless discussion about new premises at the Middle School site, and when the temporary classroom was finally condemned as unfit for use, Corbridge Youth Initiative moved into its present premises above the library in Hill Street. We pay rent to Northumberland County Council. The proposed new rent will be $\mathfrak{L}9,500$ this year rising to $\mathfrak{L}10,500$ over the next three years. For a small charity this is a significant expense.

For young people, the years between nine to 19 are formative. The influences to which young people are subject make a huge difference to their futures and to the community in which they live. Now, more than ever, Youth Services are needed.

At present we have them in this village, but for how much longer?

Ten years ago, the Corbridge Youth Initiative charity took over the major work of youth provision in the village from Northumberland County Council. The 11 trustees and five part time staff work hard to raise funds to cover the costs of youth work for those aged nine to 19. We are respected for making a significant difference to young people's lives, health and well-being. We also work in local schools.

Corbridge Youth Initiative runs groups for 4 x Juniors, 2 x Seniors, Girls, one-to-one support, an allotment, Job Club, Summer Scheme. We are fortunate that our staff are consistent, committed and well qualified. They provide many opportunities for discussion, activities, health advice and fun to help build confidence and encourage responsibility.



This playful, innovative collection has a poem for every day of the year inspired by a significant - often curious - event associated with that day: from Open an Umbrella Indoors Day to the day on which New York banned public flirting; from the launch of the Rubik's Cube to the first appearance of the phrase, 'the best thing since sliced bread'. He likes cats too.

Bookshop Day is the annual celebration of bookshops on the high street and we'll be doing just that with cake, authors and fun - all tbc at time of print - on Saturday October 8th.

Then at 2pm on Saturday October 15th we have an afternoon with the wonderful **Alexander McCall Smith** at Corbridge Parish Hall. Ever prolific he has not one but three new books - **The Sweet Remnants of Summer**, **A Song of Comfortable Chairs** and **The Joy and Light Bus Company** - and as many of you know his own company is simply a joy. And if that's not enough to tempt you along there'll be homemade cakes to accompany your afternoon.

Kate Young's 'Little Library' cook books have been a staple of mine for years - especially her Christmas one! So we are dancing with delight and popping corks as Kate joins us towards the end of October on Thursday 27th with **The Little Library Parties**.

Drawing on her experience catering for weddings and events and her love of cooking for friends, with 50 sensational new recipes for entertaining, it's a book that celebrates the time we spend with those we love the most. From dinner party feasts and canapes for a crowd to barbecues, tea parties, house parties and that all important morning after tonic, Kate provides delicious and joyful recipes - as always, inspired by her favourite literature - to ensure your get together tastes delicious. As ever there will be tasters - there might even be dancing - and most definitely fun!

Another cook book that has caught my eye - though I haven't got an author event just yet - is **Coinneach Macleod's The Hebridean Baker**.
