Council Notes

It's quite unusual for both channels of the Tyne upstream of the bridge to be full of beery-coloured river water all summer - but that's what we've had. Normally, the weaker southern section of the river bed dries out, revealing the pebbles below together with a few intermittent rock pools. The weekly bouts of heavy rain we've endured prove the point. The summer of 2023 has been a bit of a wash-out. However, despite this I've enjoyed the season and it's been lovely to see the village so consistently busy. While village residents have to accommodate day trippers and holiday makers there is no doubt that a bustling village is better



than the alternative.

A highlight of the season was the series of wonderful concerts held in St Andrew's Church. For me, this started way back in April when The Bishop's Consort performed Bach's St John Passion. I took a friend along - an Australian librettist whose works have been perfomed in Sydney Opera House and Carnegie Hall - who closely followed the entire proceedings from the accompanying booklet - in German. As someone who can just about order a coffee in Germany I was suitably impressed. The Corbridge Chamber Music Festival programme in late July was, yet again, outstanding and it was a privilege to attend the two-piano recital by the young Ukrainian Khrystyna Mykhailichenko and her colleague, the American-born pianist Cristo Harijan. Magnificent music in majestic surroundings.

I'm glad to report that work on the refurbishment of the pavillion at Corchester Field is now close to completion. It has taken some time to get the necessary legal matters in place - such as the extension of the lease the Parish Council enjoys from the Secretary of State. The Parish Council used to hold the field on a short term Licence agreement. However, taking into account our

substantial financial investment in repairing and upgrading the pavillion we thought it sensible to obtain a new 25 year lease - which is what we've done. Once the work is complete I hope to present a fuller report with photographs in a future edition of Corbridge Matters. At long last, Corchester Field is coming back to life.

I wish all of you the best in the run into Autumn.

My comments about the weather in the last column turned out to be unwise because we then had a prolonged spell of rain but, despite this, I hope everybody had a great summer and is enjoying autumn.

The Family Fun Day at the cricket club raising money for Charlotte Straker and Corbridge Youth Initiative was sadly a bit of a washout with incessant rain but over £1,000 was raised. The cricket club has also reached the first fundraising milestone to secure a grant from Sport England for new practice nets. The Village Show was once again a success with increased visitors on last year. These important community events are all organised by volunteers who contribute a lot to village life.



I was pleased to attend a lunch with the volunteers of Corbridge in Bloom following their well-deserved recognition at the Northumberland County Council celebration at Alnwick Gardens. They do so much to make our village look beautiful as you can see on the opposite page.

Much of Corbridge was not designed for the motor car and as the village has expanded there has been increasing pressure on car parking, particularly in the centre of the village. We've been hoping to expand the Village Car Park on the south side of the bridge for some time but there has been a complicated legal barrier to that. I'm pleased to say that we have managed to overcome that at last and I'm hoping Northumberland County Council can progress this much needed project in the near future. As soon as I know more, I will share details.

The proposed 20mph zone in the centre of the village will go ahead but as I write it's currently with council officers for sign-off. Attempts to widen the area covered by the zone have so far fallen flat but I will keep trying. My main concern is that we already have a 20mph zone on St Helen's Lane and people will drive out of that back into a 30mph area and then back into central 20mph zone. That might be confusing.

I was hopeful we might have seen progress on more areas in and around Corbridge being able to access full fibre broadband services but the main providers seem to have gone quiet. I've written to them requesting an update and have asked the iNorthumberland team at County Hall if there is anything they can do to help make this happen.

Youth Rugby at Tynedale is thriving. The 23/24 season is now here. Our Minis start with a county festival and our first club tour of the season sees the Under 10s and Under 12s touring in the Scottish borders in October. We have rugby for all ages: Under 6 (5 and 6 year olds) right up to our Girls Under 18s team. So why choose rugby for your children or why should they choose rugby? Last season we had over 350 players in our minis, junior and Panthers (girls) teams. We believe every player should get a fair chance and all of our teams use the half game rule which means all players get a chance to play. We believe strongly in the Rugby Football Union (RFU) core values and also in allowing our players the chance to grow and learn in creative fun games. Players become great friends and many will stay friends as adults. Our teams tour together - a chance for parents to get to know each other but also for the players to experience freedom and fun with their teammates in a new town or city. But most of all choose rugby because it's fun, creative and will challenge everyone involved with the game.

Last season was one of our best. The minis had a great time at festivals held at Percy Park, Morpeth and Newcastle Falcons. Some got to meet Newcastle players and Flash the Falcon. We also held our own festival at Tynedale in the spring, an outstanding day which saw over 800 players at Tynedale Park



and teams coming from all over the North and Scotland. Again Falcons players came for photo ops together with Flash the Falcon. The rugby mentality of the coaches, using creative games rather than drills to give the best learning environment and working with opposition teams to have close fun matches rather than one sided win at any cost



games, has paid off. Our under 13s won the County Plate, our Under 16s won the County Cup and our Under 14s won the County Cup and SG Petch 7s in the Darlington Arena. All of our Junior sides grew their membership with the Under 15s getting up to 38 members - all enjoying some

amazing coaching and a great experience. Our Junior sides were also very well represented at County and Falcons Development level showing how far those players have come and how hard they have worked.



The Panthers (Girls) sides continue to grow, Our Under 18s made the quarter finals of the national cup with a great experience taking an executive coach and many supporters down to Liverpool where they narrowly lost to St Helens. The Under 16s paired with Novos and had a very strong season while the Under 14s numbers grew to be big enough to play matches with only Tynedale players - a huge success Their season also ended at the Sevens in Darlington where they finished third, only losing all day to the eventual champions and Hosts DMP. The biggest success though was the start of our first ever Girls Under 12s team who visited a festival at Newcastle Falcons and also joined our Junior festival for the first time.

We are a welcoming club and always want new players to come and join our team. We are also on the lookout for team admins, first aiders, referees and most importantly coaches. 

The Garden House in Wallington is an exquisite country home built in 1766 and originally formed part of The Wallington Estate until 1970; whereupon it has been owned by the same family ever since. It is a most attractive stone-built Grade II* Listed detached property of distinction and set within beautiful private grounds of around 1.25-acres. It includes the former coach-house, now used as a double garage with two adjoining pavilions, an enclosed 0.5-acre paddock with stabling, a tack room, hay store and a number of additional outbuildings.

The main house has a driveway approach and an abundance of space for vehicle parking. The light, spacious and versatile accommodation retains many of the attractive period architectural features throughout and also includes a cellar. 

Read on, dear readers, read on... Happy reading!




