

Council Notes



The new year is a time of renewal and hope but this year we also need the qualities of stoicism and strength. We were all truly sad to hear of the death in the second week of December of our fellow Councillor Joanne Neal, aged 40. Joanne's unswerving positive energy and strong local knowledge was greatly valued by all of us on Corbridge Parish Council. Her love for our village was ever present. Always a promoter of opportunities for young people, Joanne championed the extension of the Parish Hall play area well before formally coming onto the Council six years ago. As the Rev. David Kennedy remarked at a packed - and very moving - memorial service in St Andrew's Church on the 3rd of January, the size of the congregation is a testament to the love the community had for Joanne. Our sincere condolences are offered to Joanne's immediate and wider family throughout Corbridge.

As we all know, the latter part of 2023 was extremely wet and at the time of writing this dreary pattern seems to be continuing. The Tyne is swollen and the fields and ground are sodden. A consequence of this foul weather has been the further loss of some mature trees on Parish Council ground. We lost two large specimens in November and a further one in December. In giving thought to their replacement - and in this period of demonstrable change in climate - we are minded to choose species with larger root systems to avoid further losses in future.

One bright note to report on - at long last - is the resolution of the overflowing problem at the pant just down from Appletree Lane at the bottom of Aydon Road. For many years this historic water hole has been affected by blockages - resulting in occasional waterflow onto the pavement and public highway. For some unfathomable reason the rate of water flow into the pant dramatically increased early in 2023 and since the low-capacity outflow pipework was damaged it could not take the water safely away. After much head scratching throughout the Summer and many visits from engineers some new pipework was installed from the pant into the main road drain. Happily, the pant is flowing nicely and the adjacent pavement is dry - when it's not raining that is.

I wish everyone all the best in the remaining winter months and the run up to the Easter period.

William has mentioned the pant in his column so I will not repeat that except to say that in all of the investigations and subsequent works diverting the flow nobody was able to explain why the water entering into the pant is now a heavy and constant flow when previously it was lighter and more intermittent as you would expect. I'm hoping that 2024 will bring some good news on additional much needed car parking for Corbridge and I expect to be able to give more detail on that in my next column. Northumbrian Water still have our skate park requisitioned as the site compound for the Corbridge pumping station upgrade which has suffered extreme delays as they changed contractor during the job. I'm hoping we will get it back later this spring and we can get on with reinstatement. After a successful trial in Tokyo, skateboarding is firmly established in the Olympic programme in Paris this year and I am in discussions with Skateboard GB, Shred the North and the NCC Sports Development team about how best to reinstate it





Josephine Butler: A woman who was unshakeable in her principles and faith

Josephine Butler, who spent her childhood and adolescence at Dilston, is regarded as one of the most important social reformers of Victorian times with one commentator even claiming she was "the most distinguished woman in the 19th century". She led the struggle, not only in Britain but across Europe and North America, for justice for women who were considered outcasts in society. Including prostitutes, prisoners and inmates of workhouses. As well as getting the age of consent raised to 16 and achieving the eventual repeal of the Contagious Diseases Acts

She was born in 1828 at Milfield Hill, just north of Wooler, the fourth of nine children to John and Hannah Grey. John was the cousin of Charles the second Earl Grey who he helped, when Charles was Prime Minister, with the passing of the Reform Bill of 1832 and the Abolition of Slavery Act in 1833 (it is Charles whose monument stands in Newcastle and is credited with Earl Grey tea), while Hannah was from French Huguenot stock.


In 1833 John was appointed Agent for the Northern Estates of the Greenwich Hospital, a huge stretch of land extending between Carlisle, Newcastle and Berwick and which included the land at Dilston confiscated from the Radcliffe family after the failed Jacobite uprising of 1715. The family moved from Milfield in 1835 to the newly built Dilston Hall on a site chosen by her parents "being above the Devil's Water and opposite the castle and because of its extraordinary natural beauty".

By the age of 17 Josephine enjoyed, despite her strict Christian upbringing, a lively social life and was said to be "strikingly beautiful, a skilful horse rider, an accomplished painter and a gifted pianist. It then appears, even in her privileged life, that she began to become aware of some of the world's injustices and a religious conviction that she had a calling". This was strengthened in 1847 when she visited her brother in Ireland during the great potato famine and so experienced first-hand people living in extreme poverty and starvation. Meanwhile back at Dilston she was meeting many overseas visitors as her father was a leading light in Europe for agricultural reforms and innovations that included new systems of agriculture both in breeding cattle and in cultivating the land.

In 1852, at the age of 23, she married George Butler in St Andrew's Church in Corbridge. George, the son of the Headmaster of Harrow School, was a brilliant scholar and athlete and referred to Josephine as "The Rose of Dilston". They began married life in Oxford until, in 1857, George was appointed Vice Principal of Cheltenham College. They moved there with their four children, the youngest being the only girl who tragically fell to her death, aged five, from a banister rushing to greet her parents.

Soon after came another move when George became Principal of Liverpool College. Here Josephine pursued a campaign for justice, both civil and legal rights, for the many prostitutes working in one of the world's largest ports - this at a time when most people condemned them for their immorality. Then in 1869 she was approached to serve with an Association aimed at repealing the Contagious Diseases Acts of earlier that decade. After taking her crusade to Europe in 1884 and the success of the repeal in 1886 she turned her attention to the White Slave Trade which involved the trafficking of young children many of whom were orphans with others being sold by poverty stricken mothers. Another campaign was for equal education rights for women and which led to them being accepted by some universities. After George died in 1890 she returned to London where only ill health restricted her active participation in the fight for female suffrage.


Meanwhile back in Dilston her mother had died in 1860. This coincided with the time when Frederick Gipps was vicar of St Andrew's and had begun his four year restoration of the church. Consequently the three lancet east windows have the dedication "To the glory of God and in loving remembrance of Hannah Eliza, wife of John Grey Esq; Dilston...by her daughters and grand daughters". The windows to

These are Forum favourites wrapped up with brown paper and string with a little hint as to what might be inside. You might get a thriller, romance, or travel...all are a guaranteed good read. And Spring brings a fresh new batch of paperbacks too. Hitting our fiction shelves are **Ann Cleeves**' The Rising Tide, Tiffany McDaniel's On The Savage Side, Sebastian Barry's Old God's Time and my book of last year Cuddy by Benjamin Myers. 
The border between Scotland and England is rich in history. It has been the site of battles, treaties, castles and crossroads. It is also a place where both countries display their nationalism: Saltires flying in the north, the Cross of St George to the south. But it can also be a lens through which to look at the changing history and identities of these two countries. Alistair Moffat is a lifelong borderer and the ideal guide on this 100 mile journey. We begin just north of the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed. Already the battlelines have been drawn - the town having been grabbed by the English from Berwickshire in 1482 and never given back. From here we will head west as our tour travels backwards and forwards through history. In all, we will walk through eight centuries before we reach journey's end at the mouth of the River Sark.

Finally, right at the start of half term, Alnwick Story Fest is back (16-18th February) to celebrate the power of stories to transform and light up our lives in this Winter festival. The line up is amazing from Val McDermid and Mari Hannah, with Ann Cleeves, David Almond, Sharon Blake, Emma Gannon, and Rebecca Smith.
