Council Notes

I would like to thank many of

you for your kind words of encouragement to Andrew Cunningham - the Parish Council's 'handyman'. Andrew's work is of great value to the village. The ability for us to get things mended, cleaned up and painted directly and promptly has made a real difference. It is vital that we support Andrew in his endeavours. We therefore plan to provide Andrew with more equipment and a base to store tools and other equipment on the Parish Hall site to make his efforts even more productive.

After receiving suggestions regarding the 'tired' condition of the toilet facilities in the Parish Hall the council has decided to investigate an upgrade. This will probably involve a refurbishment of the male toilets and possible reorganisation / refurbishment of the layout of the female toilets. The question I posed at our recent Parish Council meeting was, "Are the toilets in as good condition as the rest of the Parish Hall?" The answer is "no" and we agreed to correct

Residents living on and around Appletree Lane have raised the issue of cars using the road as a 'rat run' or short cut from Newcastle Road to Aydon Road and vice versa. Appletree Lane is an 'Access Only' road. Vehicles are not permitted to drive past the signs at either junction unless access is required to a property on Appletree Lane. It is not permitted to use it as a short cut. Many local residents use Appletree Lane to walk to the village from the Crofts estate and it is used by children to walk to school. Not only should unauthorised cars not be in the lane, they pose an additional hazard to pedestrians. The Parish Council intends to conduct a traffic survey to establish how many cars are using the lane improperly. We will provide Northumbria Police with our findings and urge them to to take all necessary action to stop this practice.

Finally, I'm glad to report that we have received a positive response from Northumberland County Council to the Parish Council's Market Place proposals. The letter of 'preapplication' advice confirmed that our scheme is likely to be supportable in planning terms subject to various considerations. This means that we can now progress to the next stage which involves detailed design and the preparation of a planning application. I will keep you informed of our progress.

I have met with the county council's broadband team and Openreach to discuss improving broadband services in Corbridge. Openreach has confirmed that parts of Corbridge not already



connected are in their commercial rollout plan and will have Ultrafast Fibre broadband installed between now and 2026. The remaining 377 Corbridge properties will be included in a new government £4,500 per property voucher scheme for Corbridge which will enable fibre installation if 136 of those properties sign up for it. If you live in one of those properties Openreach will write to you to confirm the government will pay for your broadband to be upgraded to the fastest future proofed service. You need to register for a voucher and pledge it to Openreach. When 136 properties have registered they will schedule the installation. I would urge those residents to seriously consider signing up. If we miss this opportunity it may be years before we get the chance to upgrade these properties. Do contact me if you have any questions. There has been an increase in crime in Corbridge recently with vandalism, some intimidating behaviour and break-ins. The Northumbria Police response has been immediate and I'd urge anybody who witnesses anything to report it to them via 101 on the phone or on their website. They need this information to be able to take proactive action to nip things in

Discussions with Corbridge Middle School and the county council about the 3G pitch continue and as I know more I will let everybody know. Progress on the extension of the free Corbridge Village Car Park south of the bridge continues. The county council Highways design team has now carried out surveys and prepared designs.

I have met with some residents on the new estate in Corbridge about the work that the developers have not yet completed. Many of these issues are outside of the authority of the county council. But where council officers can exert any influence, I will continue to encourage them to do so with continuing regular contact with the Highways Development and Planning Enforcement teams. The county council can only adopt the roads when all of the conditions have been met. I have also enlisted the support of our MP Guy Opperman to encourage the builders to finish the job quickly and to a high standard. Issues include site landscaping levels, water run off and completion of roads and footpaths.

1st Tynedale (Corbridge) Scouts

The 1st Tynedale (Corbridge) Scout Group is a vibrant part of the Corbridge community (and has been since 1976), with a clear mission: To contribute to the development of young people (aged six to 14) in achieving their full physical, intellectual, social, and spiritual potentials. The group emphasises the importance of individuals in society and their responsibility as citizens. As citizens, the group is most visible at the annual Remembrance Sunday Parade and the St Andrew's Church Christmas Tree Festival. Our purpose built headquarters on St Helen's Street (behind the Parish Hall) opened in 1994 and is currently undergoing a makeover. Beavers, Cubs and Scouts meet there weekly and during the summer at Dilston Scout Campsite, where they can engage in a variety of activities that promote teamwork, leadership, and citizenship.

The **Beavers**, our youngest section, focuses on fun and friendship while introducing them to the scouting experience through games, crafts, and local exploration. The section is run by Maria our experienced Beaver Scout Leader and is supported by a group of adult volunteers. We have a healthy **Cub** pack which builds on the foundation laid by the Beavers. Cubs participate in more adventurous activities, including camping and hiking, which help them develop self-reliance and a sense of service and community. The section is led by Tim, who has been a leader for 24 years. Tim will be leaving the group this summer and we all wish him the best in his future adventures.

Scouts are encouraged to take on challenges and adventures that foster independence, service, and leadership skills. Scouts engage in a wide range of activities from traditional scouting skills like knot tying and orienteering to climbing, water activities and community service projects. The Scout section is run by our new Scout Leader Howard, supported by two uniformed assistant leaders Justin and Richard.

Our sections have recently been very successful in District events and competitions, like the night hike, shooting, and bowling. The Scouts also take part in a fun and action packed winter camp called Brass Monkey and a traditional back-to-basics camp, cooking on open fires and living in green Icelandic tents.

As well as smaller section camping, the whole group camp together biannually. We have recently been to Hawkhirst at Kielder where the Beavers bell boated, Cubs canoed, Scouts used paddleboards and all sang together at the campfire. They also developed teambuilding by







orienteering, building and racing rafts, and navigating obstacles while blindfolded. This creates a wonderful sense of community and belonging and it is great to see our older teenagers mixing with, working with and supporting our young Beavers and Cubs.

Having been involved with the group myself for a few years, it is great to see the Beavers grow into teenagers who years after leaving Scouts still have fond memories of their time with 1st Tynedale (Corbridge).

The group is supported by a team of dedicated volunteers, including the committee of trustees who oversee the governance of the group. This commitment from the volunteers ensures the group can offer a high quality scouting experience to the youth of Corbridge. However, we are always in need of more adult support. We are currently looking for a new Cub leader, to ensure the group can continue to offer the wide range of activities and those positive experiences which will change the life of the young people that we work with forever.

If you would like to volunteer as a parent helper, committee member, fund raiser or even as a uniformed leader, we would love to hear from you. We always have space for one more to take on a new adventure. The Scout Association provides training for all roles and there is always support from other volunteers and the Group Scout Leader. Looking towards the future, the group will hopefully continue to provide the youth of Corbridge with a safe space to grow and become the type of citizen that will benefit our community. The scouts are hoping to travel aboard and participate in overseas scouting. We would also like to open a Squirrel section for young people between the ages of four and six. This will be dependent on finding a couple of uniformed leaders.

In summary, the 1st Tynedale Corbridge Scout Group is more than just an extracurricular activity; it's a place where young people can grow, learn, and become well-rounded individuals. Through their involvement in the Scouts, children and teenagers in Corbridge have the opportunity to develop skills that will serve them throughout their lives, making them better individuals and proactive members of society.

The Rev Linda Hunter, Assistant Curate at St Andrew's, said, "In 2022 I was absolutely astonished at the expertise, creativity and sheer number of hours that had gone into designing and creating all of the wonderful exhibits. St Andrew's looked magnificent as local people showcased their skills and talent. I have already seen some of the pieces of work for this forthcoming exhibition and have been astounded by the ingenuity and thought gone into the work. I can't wait to see what all of these talented people have in store for us this year."

Tea, coffee and biscuits will be available throughout the exhibition and a raffle will include a number of high quality hand-crafted items donated by Corbridge Sewing Bee. For an exclusive look at the items on display, a preview evening will be held on Wednesday 19th June between 7pm and 8pm. Tickets at £5 (to include a glass of wine) are available from St Andrew's Church - admincorbridgechurch@btinternet.com - and the Forum bookshop.

Entry to the exhibition on Thursday 20th and Friday 21st is free (donations welcomed) with all proceeds shared equally between the church and the Charlotte Straker Trust. As Berenice Groves, Chair of the Charlotte Straker Trust, noted, "We are delighted that the Textile and Art Exhibition will be back for 2024 and very grateful that we will receive a percentage of the donations for the event. The Craft Fest held in 2022 was a huge success and I know this year's crafters will be displaying some stunning exhibits. Some of our residents are very keen crafters and can't wait to come to the festival to see the beautiful items on display. Every penny we receive from donations will be spent on our charity funded Community Respite Care Bed to allow us to provide free of charge respite care to the community. We're so grateful to the organisers of the Craft Fest for giving this opportunity."

St Andrew's 1350th Inspiring The Future

In October we will begin a year-long celebration of an amazing anniversary. St Andrew's Church here in Corbridge will be 1350 years old. Wow, what a remarkable fact for our village.

How did it all begin?

In the 670s, St Wilfrid established two monasteries in this part of the Tyne Valley. One of them we now know as Hexham Abbey, and the other is St Andrew's, Corbridge. We know that Hexham was established in 674 and so Hexham Abbey is celebrating its 1350th anniversary this year. We don't know exactly when Corbridge was established, but it was very close to the founding of Hexham. So, in consultation with Hexham, we will be celebrating the Corbridge big anniversary from October 2024 to October 2025.

The first church building on the site of St Andrew's would have been a wooden church and staffed by monks under St Wilfrid. The original wooden structure was soon replaced by a stone church including the lower part of the present tower and the pillars of the nave which are part of the original Saxon nave walls. The church then saw massive development in the 13th century and, with some minor later additions, this is the gem we know and love today.

Who was St Wilfrid?


First, to clarify his name. It appears as either Wilfrid (from the Anglo-Saxon form Wilfrith) or Wilfred (the Latin form). So in Corbridge we have St Wilfred's Road. We tend now to use the Anglo-Saxon form today. Wilfrid was a Northumbrian and lived from 633-709. He was trained in the monastery founded by St Aidan on the Holy Island of Lindisfarne. He was clearly a man of amazing energy and strength of character. He travelled widely in Europe and was very concerned that the Church in Northumbria should follow the customs of the Roman Church rather than the Celtic or Irish tradition. He was often controversial and was twice banished. He served as Bishop of York and Bishop of Hexham. He also founded Ripon Cathedral.

Why St Andrew's?

Both Hexham Abbey and Corbridge are dedicated to Andrew the Apostle, the brother of St Peter. St Wilfrid seems to have been inspired by Andrew as a missionary Bishop. St John's Gospel tells us that Andrew was very good at bringing people to Jesus. Wilfrid was zealous for the growth of the Church. His monks would have been missionary monks, travelling widely, preaching and teaching, and baptising all who accepted the Christian faith.

What will happen during our celebration?

We hope the year will celebrate Corbridge as the community that has grown around St Andrew's Church.



Volunteers Appeal: A key part of the anniversary year will be a series of guided tours of the church highlighting its living heritage and vibrant culture. Our hope is to recruit volunteers to deliver the tours and provide a warm welcome visitors. to Previous experience is not necessary as training will be provided. A fact sheet giving additional information together with an application form are available at our church website:





So our schools, village groups and organisations are invited to share in this once in a generation anniversary.

We keep St Wilfrid's Day on October 12th, the day of his death. So the opening weekend will be Saturday 12th and Sunday 13th October. On the Saturday there will be a Church Open Day with activities, a talk, reception and music. On Sunday 13th, Bishop Helen-Ann, the Bishop of Newcastle, will come to preside and preach at the 10am service followed by a shared lunch.

During the year we will be holding various displays illustrating both the history of Corbridge and St Andrew's and interpreting the church building and the Christian faith and Christian community which inhabit it.

We are looking to have 135 trees at the Christmas Tree Festival between Friday November 29 and Tuesday December 3.

In 2025 there will be:

- · Heritage exhibitions
- a 1350 Fun Run
- · heritage walks and guided tours
- · heritage weeks illustrating aspects of our history
- a second Art Exhibition (June 5-16)
- a rainbow cascade of knitted flowers from the Church Tower
- three high-profile concerts and other musical events
- a Flower Festival (June 25-29)
- the Corbridge Chamber Music Festival with 1350 Commissioned Music
- special services and events celebrating the Christian faith
- a closing weekend in October 2025 when we hope the Archbishop of York will come to St Andrew's
- 1350 merchandise for sale

And watch this space for a St Andrew's detective investigation.

A 1350 Fabric Project

The Church Council is exploring the possibility of glazing in the Lady (side) Chapel of St Andrew's to provide a beautiful space within the church building for meetings, smaller acts of worship, children's activities etc. This will be independently heated by renewable electricity, the first stage in our commitment to working towards becoming carbon neutral. We would need community support to realise this vision but it would be a lasting legacy as we seek to cherish and develop this remarkable building for future generations. Again, watch this space for more information.

Spreading the word

We will be preparing a brochure of events that will be distributed throughout the Parish, as well as updated information through social media.

We hope that this will be an unforgettable year for our village and its parish church. We certainly are seeking to provide something for everyone. We invite you to come and join the celebration!





Trevor has been working with Alzheimer's Research to raise awareness and hopes by means of a good story to show the damage dementia can do as well as serving up a cracking crime thriller.


